New family program update "Girls joining Cub Scouts"

The goal for the Great Trail Council is to prepare our charter partners and Cub Scout packs for full Family Scouting by June 1. The official launch date nationally is set for the beginning of the 2018/2019 school year. The Great Trail Council understands that the highlight of the Scouting year is attending camp and we will be ready to take both boys and girls at our Cub Scout Day Camps, Cub Adventure Camps and WEBELOS Resident Camp this summer. Early payment discounts will be extended to new enrollees until June 30, 2018 or one week prior to the start of the camping program that they choose to attend.

Packs should now begin the process of talking with existing families to see how many sisters will want to participate. Based upon the feedback, begin securing den leadership for both boys' and girls' dens at each rank. During April and May each pack should then plan on holding a spring recruitment event. Even if your pack has not done a spring recruitment in the past, we will need each pack to do one this year. This recruitment will be an opportunity for each pack to prepare for the larger fall recruitment events that take place in August and September. Please contact your district membership chair or your district executive to set your spring recruitment date. As soon as applications and membership fees are received at the Scout Service Center the new youth are considered registered and can participate fully in Cub Scouts. Applications will not be posted until after the annual grade roll-up takes place the weekend of June 9-10, but all will be considered registered if the application and membership fees are received at the Scout Service Center. If an application is not given to your district executive or turned in at the Scout Service Center, the new Scout is not considered registered and is not covered under any accident or liability insurance and cannot earn any advancements. This is the most crucial step in the process.

Each month we will be posting information to help prepare our charter partners and Cub Scout packs to prepare to serve the entire Scouting family. If you have any questions please contact your unit commissioner, district executive or the Scout Service Center. As we grow our Scouting family, we are all ready to help you make this a positive and rewarding experience for all of the youth we serve.

Scoutbook youth advancement sync

All Scouting units with active Scoutbook subscriptions have recently been invited to complete the Scoutbook youth advancement sync with ScoutNet. The Scoutbook unit admins have been notified and given instructions on how to activate this sync by December 31, 2017.

This sync will allow units to approve advancement in Scoutbook and have it automatically sync with the BSA national database. **Scoutbook users** will no longer need to access Internet Advancement to track and report their unit advancement.

Starting January 1, 2018, units with active Scoutbook subscriptions will only be able to approve advancements for Scouts who are in the advancement sync. If you have not activated your unit and/or Scouts within your unit, you will not be able to approve advancements for that Scout(s).

Note that as a unit activates the sync, if there are Scouts who have not yet been registered (entered into ScoutNet or My.Scouting), the unit can unapprove those Scouts and continue the sync for the rest of the unit. Once registration is complete for the outstanding Scouts, the unit can then approve them and they will then be included.

Journey to Excellence for your unit

- 1. A framework for planning the year.
 - The JTE standards are based on what successful units do to continually improve.
- 2. A method for evaluating your unit.
 - JTE provides tangible measurements based on things you are likely already tracking, such as how many campouts you have, how many youth are advancing, etc., and uses simple ways to calculate your performance.
- 3. Guidance in areas where you might do better.
 - As you track your performance against the JTE standards you can easily see where you could do better.
- 4. Specific guidelines and standards of what is considered good performance.
 - JTE has specific, simple measures to help you. You can easily compare what you are doing against the standards.

Are you the best leader you can be?

One of the most important qualifications for good leaders is the willingness to perform the job to the best of their abilities.

If a mechanic is promoted to shop foreman and is not trained on how to order stock, the shop will soon run out of parts and fold. Without proper training in his/her job responsibilities and prior knowledge of the resources available to him/her, he/she cannot carry out his/her job responsibilities.

In most cases, years of advanced education and practical training are needed before advancing to a leadership position. In Scouting, all that is required for a leadership position is a willing heart, but just as the mechanic who turned shop foreman was not supplied with the tools and knowledge of available resources to get the show running smoothly, a Scout leader without training will not possess the tools and knowledge of available resources to keep the pack or den running smoothly with a high rate of efficiency and advancement.

In order to run a quality program, our leaders need to know the basic rules, regulations, and policies of the Boy Scouts of America. They need to know how to respond to the needs of our children.

In the Leader Specific training you are given all the ingredients to develop a great program. You are given the resources to expand your knowledge and try new ideas. You are given the resources to answer any question you may have along the way.

Roundtable is a monthly meeting to enhance your training. A place to get new ideas to spice up your program. It's a 90-minute session for answers to questions, sharing of ideas with other leaders, and fellowship with others like yourself who want to give the best program they can to our Scouts.

Take time to become a trained leader, your contribution to a quality program.

 - You can receive help and best practices in areas where other units have met the gold standard.

2019 World Scout Jamboree

The 2019 World Scout Jamboree application process is open! The World Scout Jamboree dates are *July* 21 – *August 2, 2019*, held at The Summit. This is the first time the WSJ will be held in the United States since 1967 (Farragut State Park, Idaho), only the second ever held in the U.S., and the first WSJ held in North America since 1983 (Alberta, Canada).

Youth must be between the ages of 14 and 17 at the time the Jamboree starts. Adult unit leaders and International Service Team (Staff) members must be 18 or older at the start of the WSJ.

A \$250 deposit is required at the time of application. If you apply before January 31, 2018, make your deposit, and make all additional payments on time, you will have a \$100 early-bird discount applied to your final payment. Applying does not guarantee a spot with the U.S. contingent. Once you finish your application, it will be sent for approval and review by the Great Trail Council and the national office. - Prints for the new water system at Camp Stambaugh have been sent out for bid. City water will be installed by the end of January.
- 2. Marnoc Lodge has agreed to buy a new lakefront shelter at Camp Stambaugh.
- The ODNR has confirmed they have no jurisdiction for Lake Stambaugh. Now we are in the process of taking water samples and if all goes well after remedial repairs Lake Stambaugh will be open in 2018.
- 4. **Dave Deibel** has offered to donate a shelter near the camp's maintenance area for storage of equipment.
- 5. The pool pump has been ordered.
- The liner is being inspected to determine if it needs replaced. The pool will be open in 2018.
- 7. New mattresses and covers have been placed at Camp Stambaugh.
- 8. The dining hall will be brought up to code in January. The Great Trail Council signed a quote with the Hobart Company to make remedial repairs at Camp Stambaugh's dining hall.
- 9. Nathan and volunteers (Rich and Ron) have been working hard to refresh the dining hall bathrooms.

Charter info

Arrowhead, Whispering Pines and Pathfinder GWR charters should be turned in by now. See the chart to the right for the time, date, and location. Units in Tri-Fires and Seneca should turn your charters in by your January roundtable. If you aren't able to turn it in, please contact your district executive as soon as possible to make arrangements to turn it in.

Moe and Lakes received their charter packets at the December roundtable. Your charter window opens January 1 and closes on February 28. Your charters must be turned in by your February roundtable. Our goal is to make sure that each district's charters are processed by their expiration date.

Registration fee increase




